For those who think that sports are evil, and Christians should not be involved, let me remind you that the writer of the book of Hebrews used sports, specifically running as a picture for the Christian life, (Hebrews 12:3)

The first event I have to mention is the Chiefs going to the Super Bowl. I will admit I am glad they have made it, not nearly as excited as I would have been a few years ago. I am one who will be glad when it is over, I get tired of hearing about it every time I turn on the tv. I did watch the AFC championship game. That is what has led me to what I would like to mention. 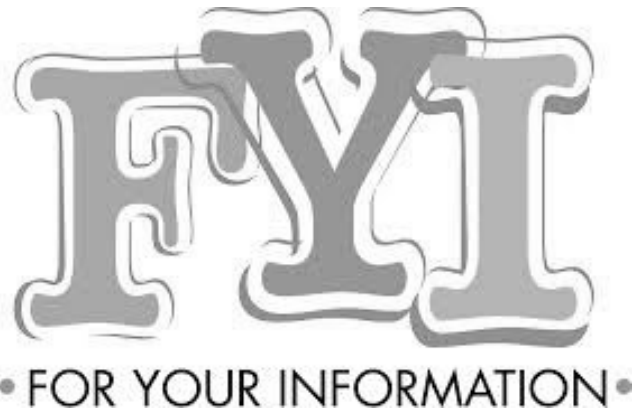

Coconut Cake

1 box white cake mix	1½ cups sugar
3 large eggs	½ cup water
1 cup milk	4 egg whites
½ cup oil	½ teaspoon cream of tartar
1 small box coconut cream instant pudding	⅛ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla	6 large marshmallows, cut into small pieces
10 ounces cream of coconut	sweetened coconut flakes
14 ounces sweetened condensed milk	

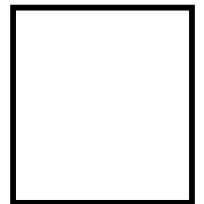
Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray 9-by-13-inch pan with cooking spray. Combine cake mix, eggs, milk, oil, pudding, and vanilla until smooth. Pour into pan. Bake 32-35 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Mix cream of coconut and condensed milk in a bowl. Poke holes in hot cake with straw or end of a wooden spoon, and slowly pour mixture over cake. Cool. Combine sugar and water in saucepan. Cook over medium heat stirring constantly, until mixture is clear. Cook, without stirring, until syrup reaches soft stage or candy thermometer registers 240°F. While syrup cooks, beat egg whites at low speed until foamy. Add cream of tartar and salt; beat at medium speed until soft peaks form. Increase to high speed, add hot syrup in a stream. Add marshmallows, a few at a time. Beat until stiff peaks form and thick enough to spread. Spread over cake. Top with coconut. Refrigerate before serving.

Hot Cocoa Cookies

½ cup unsalted butter	1½ teaspoons vanilla
1½ cups chocolate chips	12 large marshmallows
1½ cups all-purpose flour	cut in half
¼ cup cocoa powder	2 cups powdered sugar
1½ teaspoons baking powder	4 tablespoons butter
¼ teaspoon salt	¼ cup cocoa powder
1¼ cups brown sugar	¼ cup hot water
3 large eggs	½ teaspoon vanilla
	Christmas sprinkles

In saucepan, melt butter and chocolate chips. Set aside and cool. In medium bowl, mix flour, cocoa, baking powder, and salt. In another bowl, beat brown sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Mix in chocolate. Gradually add flour mixture until combined. Cover with foil and refrigerate 4 hours. Preheat oven to 325°. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Roll batter into 2-inch balls. Place cookies on baking sheet and cook 9-10 minutes. Remove from oven and press a marshmallow half into center of each cookie. Return to oven for 2-3 minutes. Cool in pan and then on wire rack. Mix powdered sugar, butter, cocoa, water, and vanilla, and spoon over cookies. Top with sprinkles. Yield: 36-48 cookies.

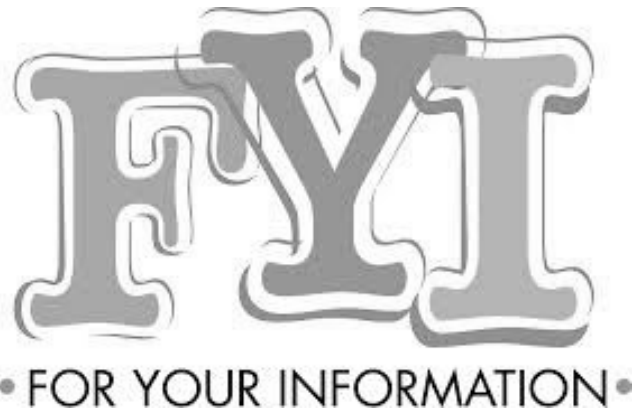

1 teaspoon vanilla	6 large marshmallows, cut into small pieces
10 ounces cream of coconut	sweetened coconut flakes
14 ounces sweetened condensed milk	

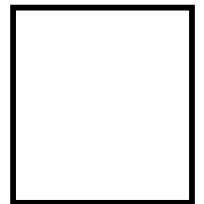

Poke holes in hot cake with straw or end of a wooden spoon, and slowly pour mixture over cake. Cool. Combine sugar and water in saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture is clear. Cook, without stirring, until syrup reaches soft stage or candy thermometer registers 240°F. While syrup cooks, beat egg whites at low speed until foamy. Add cream of tartar and salt; beat at medium speed until soft peaks form. Increase to high speed, add hot syrup in a stream. 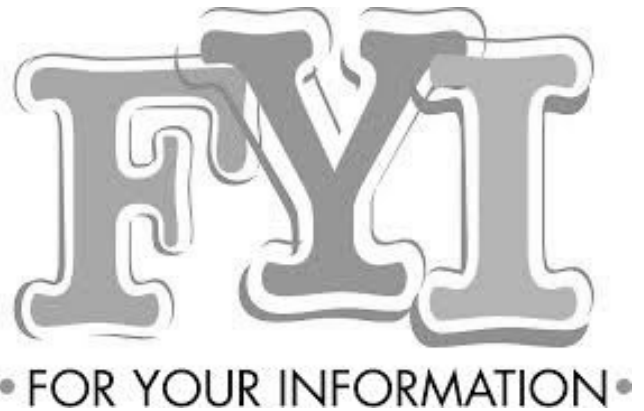

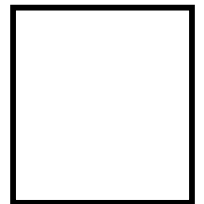

Add marshmallows, a few at a time. Beat until stiff peaks form and thick enough to spread. Spread over cake. Top with coconut. Refrigerate before serving.

1 box white cake mix	1½ cups sugar
3 large eggs	½ cup water
1 cup milk	4 egg whites
½ cup oil	½ teaspoon cream of tartar
1 small box coconut cream instant pudding	⅛ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla	6 large marshmallows, cut into small pieces
10 ounces cream of coconut	sweetened coconut flakes
14 ounces sweetened condensed milk	

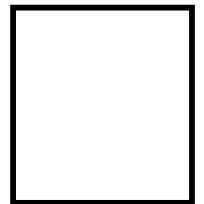
Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray 9-by-13-inch pan with cooking spray. Combine cake mix, eggs, milk, oil, pudding, and vanilla until smooth. Pour into pan. Bake 32-35 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Mix cream of coconut and condensed milk in a bowl. Poke holes in hot cake with straw or end of a wooden spoon, and slowly pour mixture over cake. Cool. Combine sugar and water in saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture is clear. Cook, without stirring, until syrup reaches soft stage or candy thermometer registers 240°F. While syrup cooks, beat egg whites at low speed until foamy. Add cream of tartar and salt; beat at medium speed until soft peaks form. Increase to high speed, add hot syrup in a stream. Add marshmallows, a few at a time. Beat until stiff peaks form and thick enough to spread. Spread over cake. Top with coconut. Refrigerate before serving.

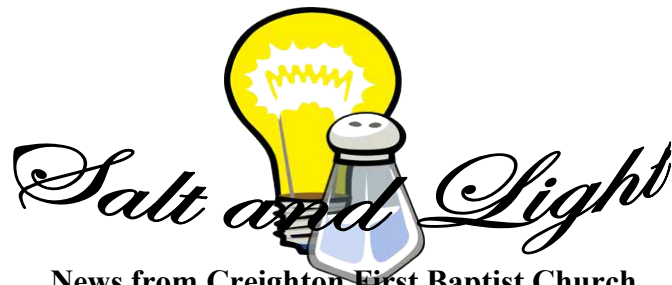

Place cookies on baking sheet and cook 9-10 minutes. Remove from oven and press a marshmallow half into center of each cookie. Return to oven for 2-3 minutes. Cool in pan and then on wire rack. Mix powdered sugar, butter, cocoa, water, and vanilla, and spoon over cookies. Top with sprinkles. Yield: 36-48 cookies.

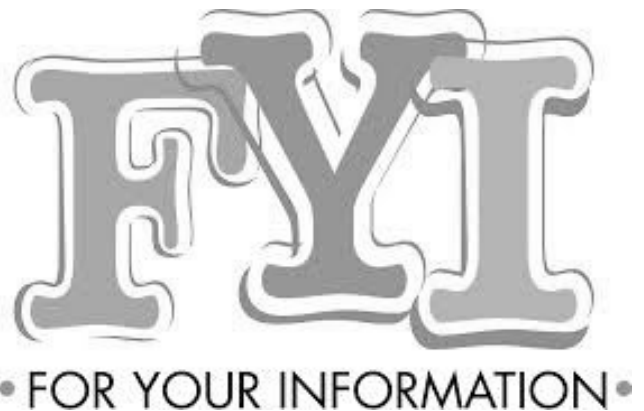

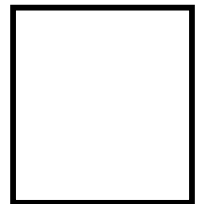

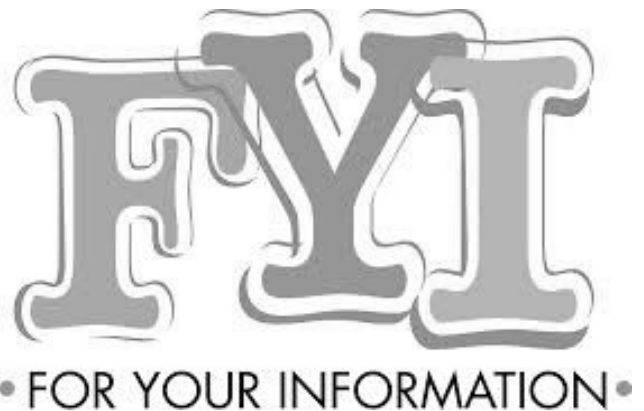

In saucepan, melt butter and chocolate chips. Set aside and cool. In medium bowl, mix flour, cocoa, baking powder, and salt. In another bowl, beat brown sugar, eggs, and vanilla. Mix in chocolate. Gradually add flour mixture until combined. Cover with foil and refrigerate 4 hours. Preheat oven to 325°. Line baking sheet with parchment paper. Roll batter into 2-inch balls. Place cookies on baking sheet and cook 9-10 minutes. Remove from oven and press a marshmallow half into center of each cookie. Return to oven for 2-3 minutes. Cool in pan and then on wire rack. Mix powdered sugar, butter, cocoa, water, and vanilla, and spoon over cookies. Top with sprinkles. Yield: 36-48 cookies.
