Who set you there.

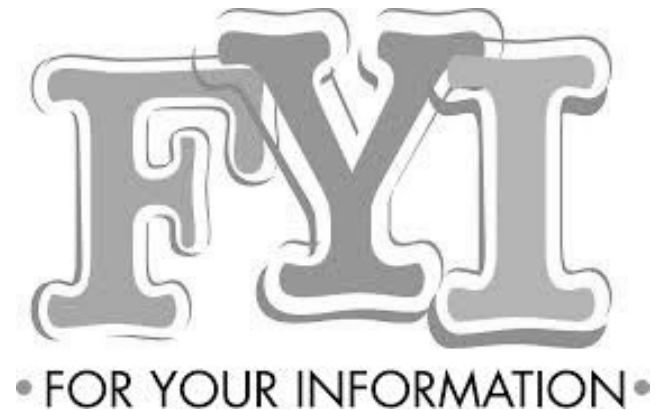

### Strawberry-Peach Cobbler

1/2 cup butter  
 3 cups diced fresh peaches  
 1 cup sliced fresh strawberries  
 1 cup sugar, divided  
 1 cup flour  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 pinch salt  
 1 cup cold milk  
 1 teaspoon vanilla

Preheat oven to 350° F. Use butter to grease the inside of a Dutch oven. Melt remaining butter in microwave or on stove top, and set aside. In a bowl, combine peaches and strawberries, and sprinkle with 1 tablespoon sugar. Toss well, and let sit while preparing the rest. Whisk together remaining sugar, flour, baking powder, salt, milk, and vanilla in another bowl. Add melted butter, and mix vigorously. Pour batter into the Dutch oven. Top with fruit mixture, spreading it evenly and pressing it lightly into the batter. Bake, uncovered, for one hour. Serve warm, with vanilla ice cream if desired. Serves 4-6.

### Fresh Salsa

1 cup finely chopped green pepper  
 1 large tomato, cored and chopped fine  
 1 1/2 jalapeno peppers, cored, seeded, and chopped fine  
 1/4 cup onion, chopped fine  
 1 1/2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar  
 1 teaspoon honey  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper  
 1/2 teaspoon chili powder  
 For spicy salsa, add:  
 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper  
 1/8 to 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce

Combine all ingredients, and mix. Cover, and refrigerate for 1 to 2 hours before tasting. Adjust ingredients to taste. Serve with tortilla chips.
