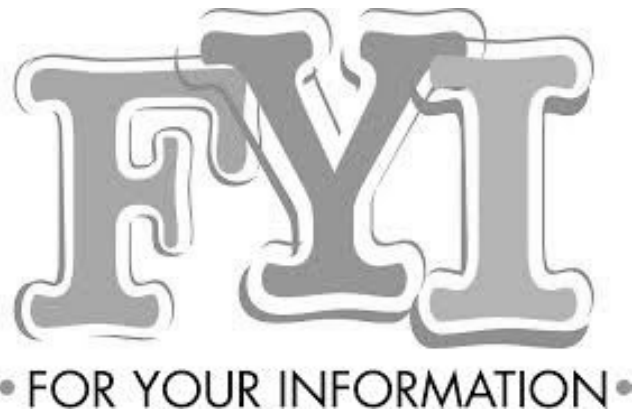

Lemon Cheesecake

14 graham crackers	1 cup sugar
4 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted	1 tablespoon lemon zest
3 tablespoons sugar	4 eggs
1/8 teaspoon salt	1 cup sour cream
32 ounces cream cheese, room temperature	Pinch of salt
	Lemon curd

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a food processor, pulse graham crackers to fine crumbs. In a bowl, mix together cracker crumbs, butter, sugar, and salt until uniform and it looks like wet sand. Press into bottom and up sides of a 9-inch springform pan. Bake 15 minutes; set aside. Beat cream cheese with a mixer until smooth. Beat in sugar and lemon zest. Beat in eggs one at a time. Fold in sour cream and salt. Spoon into crust and smooth top. Wrap bottom and sides of pan in foil, and bake about 1 hour 10 minutes, until top is set but cheesecake is still jiggly. Cool in oven for about 1.5 hours, cracking the oven open with a wooden spoon after 1 hour. Cool to room temperature. Refrigerate at least 6 hours. To serve, spread top with lemon curd and cut into slices. Makes approximately 10 servings.

No-Churn Vanilla Ice Cream

1 cup heavy whipping cream
2 teaspoons vanilla
14-ounce can sweetened condensed milk

Using a mixer with a whisk attachment, beat heavy cream until it starts to thicken. Add vanilla. Beat until some soft peaks form. Add condensed milk while beating, and continue to beat about 5 minutes to incorporate air and make stiffer peaks. Transfer to a freezer-safe container. Cover with plastic wrap, pressing wrap down to the ice cream mixture. Freeze at least four hours before serving in scoops.

Makes about 4 cups.
