Community of Care

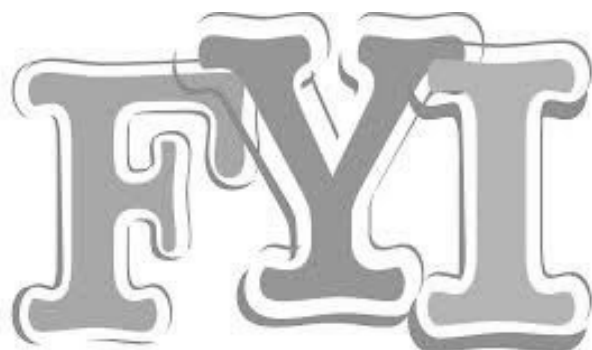
The Creighton Community of Care will be the hands and feet of Christ and respond to needs in the Creighton area, guided by Matthew 25:35-40.

Peach Lemonade

- 3 large peaches
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 4 cups cold water, divided
- 1 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice, strained (about 5-6 lemons)

Peel peaches, remove pits, and cut into thin slices. Add peaches to a large saucepan with sugar, vanilla, and 2 cups water. Bring to a simmer over medium-high heat; reduce to medium-low and cook 8-to minutes, until peaches are soft but not mushy. Strain mixture through a sieve into a pitcher. Add a few peach slices, lemon juice, and additional 2 cups water. Refrigerate until cold, and serve over ice. Yields 6 servings.

Peach Custard Pie

- 29-ounce can sliced peaches in heavy syrup
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{8}$ teaspoon nutmeg
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon cinnamon
- 3 eggs
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup buttermilk
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter, melted and cooled
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 refrigerated pie crusts
- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar

Preheat oven to 400 F Drain peaches, reserving 3 tablespoons of syrup. In a large bowl, combine cornstarch, sugar, nutmeg, and cinnamon. Add eggs, buttermilk, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter, vanilla, and reserved peach syrup; stir to combine. Gently stir in peach slices until well coated. Fit one pie crust into to-inch pie pan. Pour in filling. Top with second crust and flute edges together. Brush top crust with the $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon melted butter and then sprinkle with 2 tablespoons sugar. Cut slits in top crust to allow steam to escape. Bake about 50 minutes, until crust is brown and filling is bubbly. Cool to room temperature before cutting. Yields 8-10 slices.
