

Balsamic Green Bean Salad

2 lbs. fresh green beans, trimmed and cut into 1-1/2inch pieces

1/4 C. olive oil

3 T. lemon juice

3 T. balsamic vinegar

1/4 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1/4 tsp. ground mustard
1/8 tsp. pepper
1 large red onion, chopped
4 C. cherry tomatoes, halved
1 C. crumbled feta cheese

Place beans in a 6-qt. stockpot; add water to cover. Bring to a boil. Cook, covered, 8-10 minutes or until crisp-tender. Drain and immediately place in ice water. Drain and pat dry. In a small bowl, whisk oil, lemon juice, vinegar, salt, garlic powder, mustard and pepper. Drizzle over beans. Add onion; toss to coat. Refrigerate, covered, at least 1 hour. Just before serving, stir in tomatoes and cheese.

Watermelon Salad with Feta

Dressing
2 T. olive oil
3 T. lime juice
1 avocado, cubed
1/2 garlic clove, minced
1/2 tsp. sea salt
1/2 C. thinly sliced red onions
1/3 C. crumbled feta cheese
1 avocado, cubed
1/2 C. torn mint or basil leaves
1/2 jalapeno or serrano pepper,
1/2 thinly sliced, optional
1/3 C. cubed watermelon
1/2 C. thinly sliced red onions
1/3 C. crumbled feta cheese
1/2 jalapeno or serrano pepper,
1/2 thinly sliced, optional
1/3 C. crumbled feta cheese
1/2 salapeno or serrano pepper,
1/3 C. crumbled feta cheese
1/4 C. thinly sliced red onions
1/4 C. torn mint or basil leaves
1/2 jalapeno or serrano pepper,
1/4 C. thinly sliced red onions
1/4 C.

1 C. diced English cucumber

Make the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, lime juice, garlic and salt. Arrange the watermelon, cucumber, and red onions on a large plate or platter. Drizzle with half the dressing. Top with the feta, avocado, mint, and serrano pepper, if using, and drizzle with remaining dressing.'

Season to taste and serve.
