

Apple Salad

- 1-1/2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1-1/2 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon minced shallot
- 2 teaspoons whole-grain Dijon mustard
- 2 teaspoons honey
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- ¹/₄ freshly ground black pepper
- 2 cups thinly sliced Fuji apple
- 1 5-oz. package mixed spring greens

Combine olive oil, vinegar, shallot, mustard, honey, salt, and pepper in a large bowl, stirring with a whisk. Add apple and greens; toss to coat.

Garlic Green Beans

1-1/2 pounds fresh green beansKosher salt, to taste2 tablespoons olive oil3 cloves garlic, chopped2 tablespoons salted butterGround black pepper, to taste

Heat a large pot of water over high heat until boiling. Season generously with salt. Add the green beans and cook for 3 to 5 minutes, until tender, yet still crisp. Drain and rinse under cold water to cool. Return the pot to medium heat. Add the olive oil and garlic. Cook for 1 minute, until fragrant. Add the beans to the pot and stir gently to combine. Add the butter to melt and salt and pepper to taste.



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
