Zucchini Dressing

3 eggs 1 med onion, chopped
1 tsp oregano, dried 1 1/2 C. baking mix
1 tsp black pepper, coarsely ground grated
1 tsp salt 4 C grated zucchini
1/2 C. vegetable oil

Mix together the eggs, oil, spices, and baking mix. Add the shredded zucchini. Mix in the onion and cheese. Reserve some cheese for the topping. Spread mixture into an 8x10 inch glass dish and top with cheese. Bake in preheated 350-degree oven for 50-60 minutes.

Applesauce Cake

2 1/4 C. flour
3/4 C. sugar
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. baking powder
3/4 tsp. salt
2 tsp. ground cinnamon
1 tsp. ground ginger
1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
1/4 tsp. ground allspice
3/4 C. sugar
1/2 C. brown sugar
2 large eggs
2 C. unsweetened applesauce
3/4 C. canola oil
1 tsp. vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 13 by 9-inch baking dish with non-stick cooking spray. In a large mixing bowl whisk together flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, and allspice for 30 seconds. Make a well in the center and set aside. In a mixing bowl add granulated sugar, brown sugar, and eggs. Using an electric hand mixer beat on medium speed until fairly pale and fluffy. Add applesauce, vegetable oil and 1 tsp vanilla extract to sugar mixture and blend with hand mixer until combined. Pour applesauce mixture into well in flour mixture then gently fold and stir mixture just until there's no longer streaks or pockets of flour. Mixture will be lumpy and that's okay. Pour mixture into prepared baking dish. Wiggle pan to level batter out even. Bake about 30 to 40 minutes.



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
