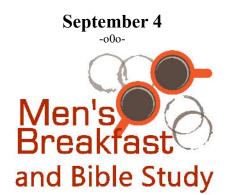

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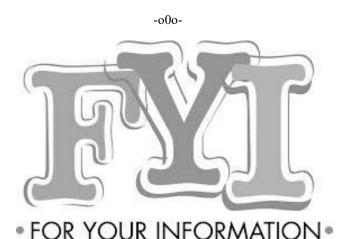

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Best Potato Salad

- 5 lbs. Yukon Gold potatoes
- 2 C. mayonnaise
- 1 C. refrigerated sweet pickle relish
- 2 T. yellow mustard 1 T. apple cider vinegar
- 1 T. celery seeds
- ½ tsp. paprika
 4-5 hard-boiled eggs, peeled and chopped
 3 celery stalks, diced
 ½ C. sweet onions, diced
 1 T. fresh chopped dill
 Salt and pepper

Cut the potatoes into quarters and place them in a large stockpot. Fill the pot with cold water until it is 1 inch over the potatoes. Bring to a boil. Once boiling, add 1 tablespoon salt and cook the potatoes for 13-15 minutes. Meanwhile, in a medium bowl mix the mayonnaise, relish including juices, mustard, vinegar, celery seeds, paprika, 1 teaspoon salt, and pepper to taste. Then chop the eggs, celery, onions, and dill. Once the potatoes are tender, drain off water. Remove peels and chop the potatoes into 1/2-inch chunks. Place the potatoes in a large bowl. Mix in the dressing until it coats the potatoes. Then stir in the eggs, celery, onions, and dill. Salt and pepper as needed. Garnish with fresh dill and paprika. Cover and refrigerate for at least 4 hours.

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Tomato Salad With Creme Fraiche and Olive Granola

- ½ C. salt-cured black olives, Pitted, coarsely chopped
 ¼ C. raw sunflower seeds
 2 T. sesame seeds
 1½ tsp. fennel seeds
 Pinch of crushed red pepper flakes
 1 T. pure maple syrup
 ½ tsp. soy sauce
- 2 t. olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 2 lbs. tomatoes,
- sliced into 1/2"
- thick rounds
- Kosher salt
- 1 8-0z. container crème fraiche
- 2 tsp. fresh lemon juice

Preheat oven to 375°. Toss black olives, raw sunflower seeds, sesame seeds, fennel seeds and red pepper flakes with maple syrup, soy sauce, and olive oil on a rimmed baking sheet. Arrange in an even layer and bake until golden brown, 14-16 minutes. Let granola cool. Arrange tomatoes on a large plate or baking sheet; drizzle with oil and season with kosher salt. Gently turn to coat well. Stir creme fraiche and lemon juice in a small bowl to combine; season with kosher salt. Spread creme fraiche mixture across a platter, then top with seasoned tomatoes, leaving any juices on plate behind. Scatter granola over.
