# **Community of Care**


The Creighton Community of Care will be the hands and feet of Christ and respond to needs in the Creighton area, guided by Matthew 25:35-40.

### **Strawberry Bread**



### **Bacon Wrapped Asparagus Bundles**

1/2 lb. asparagus spears, trimmed A few grinds black pepper 4 or 5 inches long tips Extra-virgin olive oil, for Drizzling

4 slices center cut bacon or pancetta

Chopped chives or scallions, Optional garnish

Preheat oven, if using, to 400 degrees F. Lightly coat asparagus spears in extra-virgin olive oil. Season the asparagus with black pepper. Take a quick count of the spear tips. Divide the total number by four. Gather that number of spears and use a slice of bacon to wrap the bundle and secure the spears together. Repeat with remaining ingredients.

To grill, place bundles on hot grill and cover. Cook 10 to 12 minutes until bacon is crisp and asparagus bundles are tender. For oven preparation, place bundles on slotted broiler pan. Bake 12 minutes.

2 C. flour 3/4 C. buttermilk, at room 1 ½ tsp. baking powder temperature 1/3 C. vegetable oil or melted 1/4 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt coconut oil 2 tsp, pure vanilla extract 1 large egg, at room 1 ½ C. fresh strawberries, temperature 3/4 C. granulated sugar chopped, tossed in 1 T. flour 1/2 tsp. freshly ground pepper 3 C. grated peeled carrots 1/4 C. brown sugar, packed

Preheat oven to 350° F. Grease an 8x4-inch loaf pan. In a large bowl, whisk the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt together until combined.

Whisk the egg, granulated sugar, brown sugar and buttermilk together until combined. Add the oil and vanilla. Slowly pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and gently whisk. Avoid over-mixing. Gently fold in the strawberries. Pour/spoon batter into prepared loaf pan.

Bake for 55-70 minutes, loosely cover the bread with aluminum foil halfway through to prevent the top from getting too brown. The bread is done when a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean with only a few small moist crumbs.

Remove bread from the oven and allow the bread to cool in the pan for about an hour, then remove bread from the pan.
