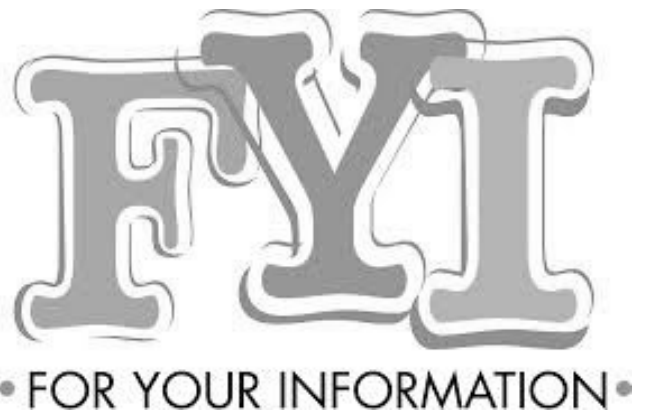

Cheesy Cornbread with Tomatoes

1/4 C. plus 1 T. extra-virgin olive oil; plus more for pan	1 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1-1/3 C. yellow cornmeal	2 large eggs
1/2 C. flour	1 1/2 C. sour cream
2 T. sugar	4 oz. feta, crumbled
2 tsp. baking powder	8 oz. cherry tomatoes, halved
1-1/4 tsp. kosher salt	Flaky sea salt

Place a rack in the middle of oven; preheat to 400°. Brush a 9" diameter cake pan with oil. Line the bottom of pan with a parchment paper; brush with more oil. Whisk cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl.

Whisk eggs, sour cream, 1/4 cup olive oil, and 1/4 cup water in a large bowl until homogeneous. Add dry ingredients; mix until almost combined. Add feta; crumbled, and gently fold to incorporate. Scrape batter into prepared pan.

Toss tomatoes, halved, and remaining oil in a medium bowl. Arrange, cut side up, on top of batter; sprinkle with flaky sea salt. Bake cornbread 35-40 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack and let cool.

Watermelon Cake

1 box white cake mix	2 1/2 C. vanilla frosting
1 3 oz. box watermelon Jell-O	red and green gel food coloring
1 1/4 C. water	chocolate chips for decorating
2 large eggs	
1/4 C. canola oil	

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease and flour two 9" round cake pans. Mix cake mix, Jell-O, water, eggs and oil. Beat on medium speed for 2 minutes until smooth. Split the batter evenly between both prepared cake pans. Bake for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Let cool in the pan for 10 minutes before removing and placing on a rack to finish cooling completely.

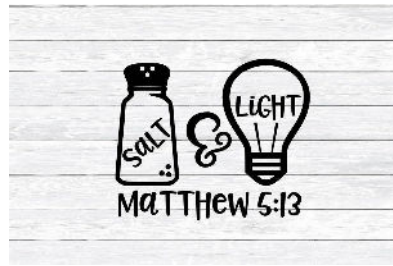
Set aside 2 tbsp of frosting for garnish. Place 1 1/4 cups of frosting in a bowl and tint with red coloring. Tint the remaining frosting green. Set aside.

Place one cake layer on a serving plate and frost the top with red frosting leaving a 1/4" around the edge. Place the remaining cake on top and frost with remaining red frosting leaving 3/4" around the edge. Frost the remaining areas of the cake with green. Pipe the leftover white frosting where the red meets the green on top. Decorate with the chocolate chips.

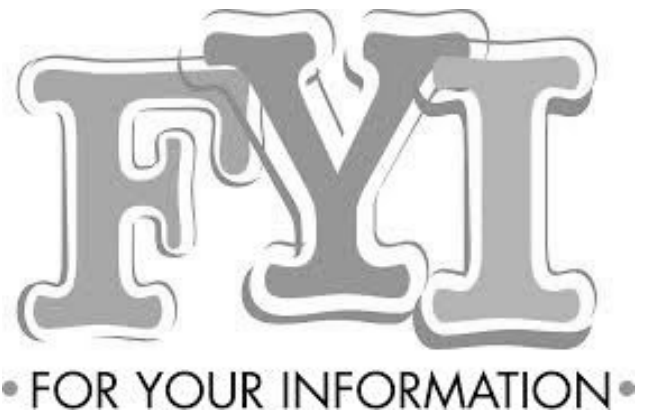

1/4 C. plus 1 T. extra-virgin olive oil; plus more for pan	1 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1-1/3 C. yellow cornmeal	2 large eggs
1/2 C. flour	1 1/2 C. sour cream
2 T. sugar	4 oz. feta, crumbled
2 tsp. baking powder	8 oz. cherry tomatoes, halved
1-1/4 tsp. kosher salt	Flaky sea salt

Place a rack in the middle of oven; preheat to 400°. Brush a 9" diameter cake pan with oil. Line the bottom of pan with a parchment paper; brush with more oil. Whisk cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl.

Whisk eggs, sour cream, 1/4 cup olive oil, and 1/4 cup water in a large bowl until homogeneous. Add dry ingredients; mix until almost combined. Add feta; crumbled, and gently fold to incorporate. Scrape batter into prepared pan.

Toss tomatoes, halved, and remaining oil in a medium bowl. Arrange, cut side up, on top of batter; sprinkle with flaky sea salt. Bake cornbread 35-40 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack and let cool.

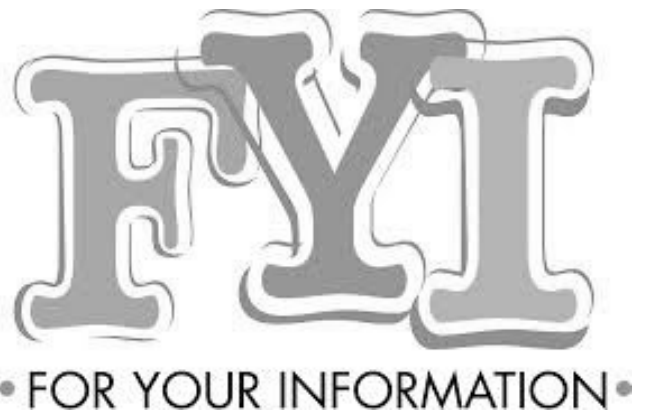
