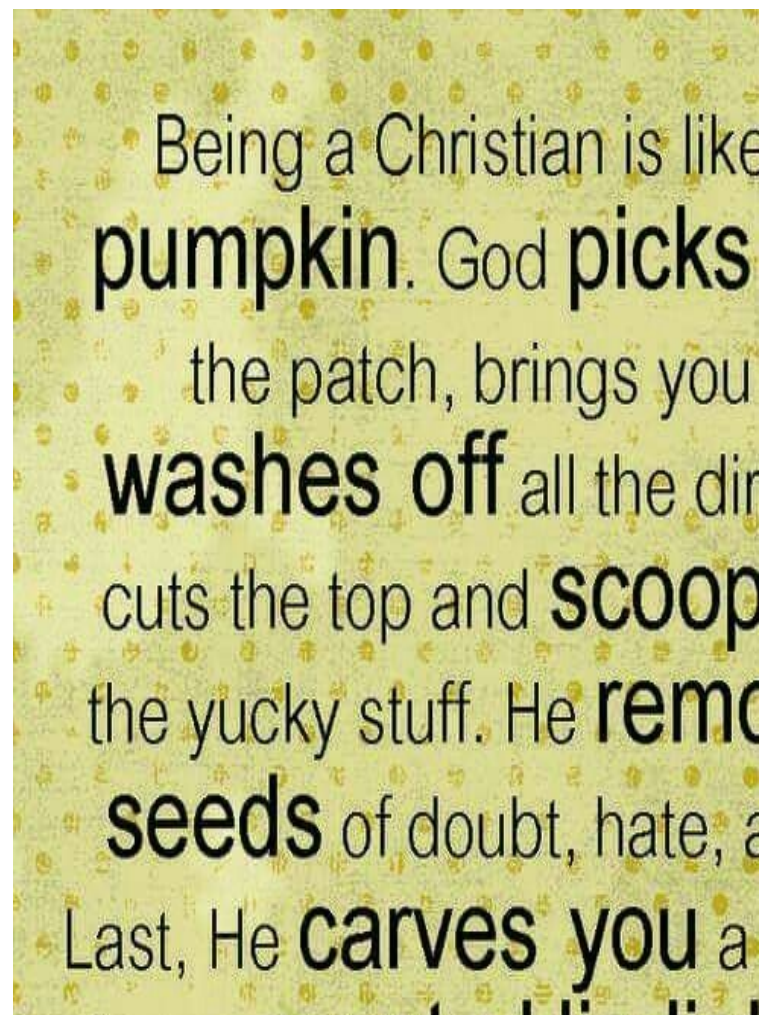

Baby Potatoes with Butter & Herbs

2lb new potatoes	2 T. fresh dill, finely chopped
1 T. salt, for cooking	1 T. chives, finely chopped
2 T. unsalted butter	1 T. parsley, finely chopped
½ tsp. each salt and pepper	

Boil potatoes: Place potatoes in a large pot of cold tap water With salt. Bring to a boil over high heat, then lower heat to Medium so they're simmering gently, this stops skin splitting.

Cook for 10-15 minutes until there's no resistance when Pierced with a knife. Alternatively, steam the potatoes.

Steam dry: Drain in colander then leave for a minute to let the potatoes steam dry.

Toss with butter: Transfer to a bowl, add salt, pepper and butter. Toss to melt and coat.

Add herbs just before serving. Stir thoroughly.

Southern Tomato Gravy

3 T. fat	1 4.5-ounce can diced
3 T. flour	tomatoes, undrained
1 1/3 C. chicken broth/ stock	½ tsp. salt
	½ tsp. pepper

In a skillet over medium heat, whisk the flour into the warm fat. Cook, stirring constantly, until the flour just starts to brown and smells nutty. Slowly whisk in the chicken broth and stir until smooth. Add the undrained tomatoes. Add salt and pepper to taste. Cook until thickened—about 5 minutes, stirring very frequently.
