CHEESY ONION CASSEROLE

3 lbs. sweet onions
1 tsp. garlic salt
½ tsp. mustard powder
½ tsp. dried thyme
1 sleeve Ritz crackers

4 T. butter divided 1 C. shredded gruyere 1 C. shredded smoked gouda ½ tsp. paprika ¼ tsp. ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 350°F and grease a 9x13-inch pan. Remove the ends and skins from the onions cut into rings about 1/2-3/4-inch wide. Arrange onion rings in prepared pan. Mix together the seasonings and sprinkle over onions. Top with shredded cheese. Cut half of

the butter into thin slices and distribute over cheese. Cover the pan tightly with foil and bake for 50 minutes. The onions should look softened. Melt the remaining butter. Crush the crackers into crumbs and toss in the melted butter. Sprinkle over the casserole.

Bake for 15 more minutes, this time uncovered.

SWEET CREAMED CORN CASSEROLE

1 stick butter
1 15-oz can whole corn
Kernels, drained
1 15-oz can creamed corn,
not drained
1 1 C. sour cream
3 T. sugar
1/2 tsp. kosher salt
1 8-oz box corn
muffin mix

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. In an 8x8 or 9x9 inch glass baking dish, place the butter. Microwave it until melted in the dish. Use a spatula to coat the sides of the pan. Add the drained corn into the buttered pan. Pour the entire can of creamed corn into the pan. Mix in sour cream. Add sugar and kosher salt, reduce to ½ teaspoon if using table salt.

Stir in the corn muffin mix. Combine everything thoroughly, scraping down the sides. Bake for approximately 35-40 minutes.



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
