# **Carrot Cake**

unsalted butter, for the pan 2½ C. flour, plus extra for pan 6 medium grated carrots, medium grate 1 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. baking soda ¼ tsp. ground allspice ¼ tsp. ground cinnamon

½ tsp. freshly ground nutmeg
½ tsp. salt
1 1/3 C. sugar
¼ C. dark brown sugar, firmly packed
3 large eggs
6 oz. plain yogurt
6 oz. vegetable oil

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Butter and flour a 9x13 inch round cake pan. Line the bottom with parchment paper. Set aside. Put the flour, baking powder, baking soda, spices and salt in the bowl of a food processor and process for 5 seconds. Add this mixture to a bowl with the carrots and toss until they are well-coated with the flour. In the bowl of the food processor combine the sugar, brown sugar, eggs and yogurt. With the processor still running drizzle in the vegetable oil. Pour this mixture into the carrot mixture and stir until just combined. Pour into the prepared cake pan and bake on the middle rack of the oven for 45 minutes. Reduce the heat to 325 degrees F and bake for another 20 minutes or until the cake reaches 205 to 210 degrees F in the center.

Remove the pan from the oven and allow cake to cool 15 minutes in the pan. After 15 minutes, turn the cake out onto a rack and allow cake to cool completely. From with cream cheese frosting after cake has cooled completely.

# **Raspberry Dip**


2 C. sharp cheddar cheese, grated Kosher ground taste.

2 C. raspberry preserves Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste.

1 C. green onions, chopped

In a medium bowl, stir together the cheese, mayo, pecans and green onion. Spread mixture in a 9x9-inch baking pan or 9-inch pie pan.

Spread raspberry preserves over the top in an even layer. Chill in refrigerator at least 1 hour before serving.
