





Listen for Joseph's new job. Genesis 39:21-23 (NIV) the LORD was with him; he showed him kindness and granted him favor in the eyes of the prison warden. 22 So the warden put Joseph in charge of all those held in the prison, and

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he was made responsible for all that was done there. 23 The warden paid no attention to anything under Joseph's care, because the LORD was with Joseph and gave him success in whatever he did.

God's Favor Is Not Hindered

- In what ways does this episode parallel Joseph's rise to success in Potiphar's house?
- What evidence suggests that Joseph made diligent effort even in dark circumstances?
- When have you questioned God due to your circumstances?
- What is your first reaction when someone acts unjustly towards you?

God's Favor Is Not Hindered

- Why do our circumstances affect our view of God's love and loyalty to us?
- What are the ways that God shows grace to you during setbacks in your life?
- So, how do we remain faithful when we find ourselves where we didn't expect to be?

Listen for two dreamers.

Genesis 40:5-8 (NIV) each of the two menthe cupbearer and the baker of the king of Egypt, who were being held in prison--had a dream the same night, and each dream had a meaning of its own. 6 When Joseph came to them the next morning, he saw that they were dejected. 7 So he

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asked Pharaoh's officials who were in custody with him in his master's house, "Why are your faces so sad today?" 8 "We both had dreams," they answered, "but there is no one to interpret them." Then Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell me your dreams."

God Can Use Any Situation

- What did Joseph ask Pharaoh's officials, and what was their answer?
- What did Joseph say about dreams?
- How might Joseph have recognized that he was in prison for a purpose?

God Can Use Any Situation

- Do you think the ability to interpret dreams a common spiritual gift or a limited, biblical experience?
- What do you find most remarkable about Joseph's faith?
- What are some little ways that allow us to demonstrate God's concern to others?

Listen for a twist in the plot.

Genesis 41:10-14 (NIV) Pharaoh was once angry with his servants, and he imprisoned me and the chief baker in the house of the captain of the guard. 11 Each of us had a dream the same night, and each dream had a meaning of its own. 12 Now a young Hebrew was there with us, a servant of the captain of the guard. We told him our dreams, and

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he interpreted them for us, giving each man the interpretation of his dream. 13 And things turned out exactly as he interpreted them to us: I was restored to my position, and the other man was hanged." 14 So Pharaoh sent for Joseph, and he was quickly brought from the dungeon. When he had shaved and changed his clothes, he came before Pharaoh.

Faithfulness to God

- Who is the speaker in verses 10-13? What did he suddenly remember?
- How did the butler's remembrance of Joseph benefit Joseph and open the door for a greater opportunity?

Faithfulness to God

- How can a difficult period in your life prepare you for a greater opportunity?
- How has faithfulness in small situations opened the door for larger opportunities in your life?

Application

- Pray about everything.
 - Develop the habit of conversing with God about your daily experiences and emotions.
 - Read 1 Thessalonians 5:17 and 1 Peter 5:7, then pray throughout the day.

Application

- Fuel your faith.
 - God is bigger than your problems, pain, fears, and future.
 - Make a list of your current trials and difficulties.
 - Read and reflect on these verses this week with your list of troubles in hand: Job 42:2; Matthew 10:29-31; 19:26; 2 Corinthians 4:16-18; 1 Peter 1:6-7.

Application

- Reconsider your perspective about suffering.
 - Life is hard and unfair. People can be thoughtless and cruel.
 - But God is good.
 - Meditate on what Joseph said to his brothers in Genesis 50:20.
 - How could that perspective help you?
